2. Requirements

2.1. Scope of Work / Specifications

SCS shall award the bid to a single contractor. The awarded contractor shall be the sole contact for SCS, and all payments shall only be made to the general contractor. Payment to any sub-contractor, if applicable, shall be the sole responsibility of the general contractor.

Sports Laundry & Storage

Designed by Tait Hanson - Construction CTE Teacher (615) 979-7319

All work below done in conjunction with supplied construction drawings.

All products need to be applied per manufacturer instructions including any recommended prep work.

Paint: Sherwin Williams "Teardrop white" oil-based gloss. Applied over a primer coat. (Kilz or equivalent) Include football restroom and PE restroom when painting. Paint all shelving as well.

Epoxy: Cover floors and tile shower walls in epoxy. Include football restroom and PE restroom when painting. Prep first by sealing holes and cracks. (see existing epoxy floors in building and match)

Construction: build 6" CMU wall per drawings with 44" wood door to match existing door. Locks from both sides. Build 7' long 6" PT stud wall for plumbing. Cover with mold resistant drywall and then plastic waterproof wall panel on mop sink side of wall. Build 6" CMU wall to ceiling in football shower area. Create a 60" metal frame cased opening in keeping with existing building. Remove shower curb per drawings. Install black base trim where appropriate.

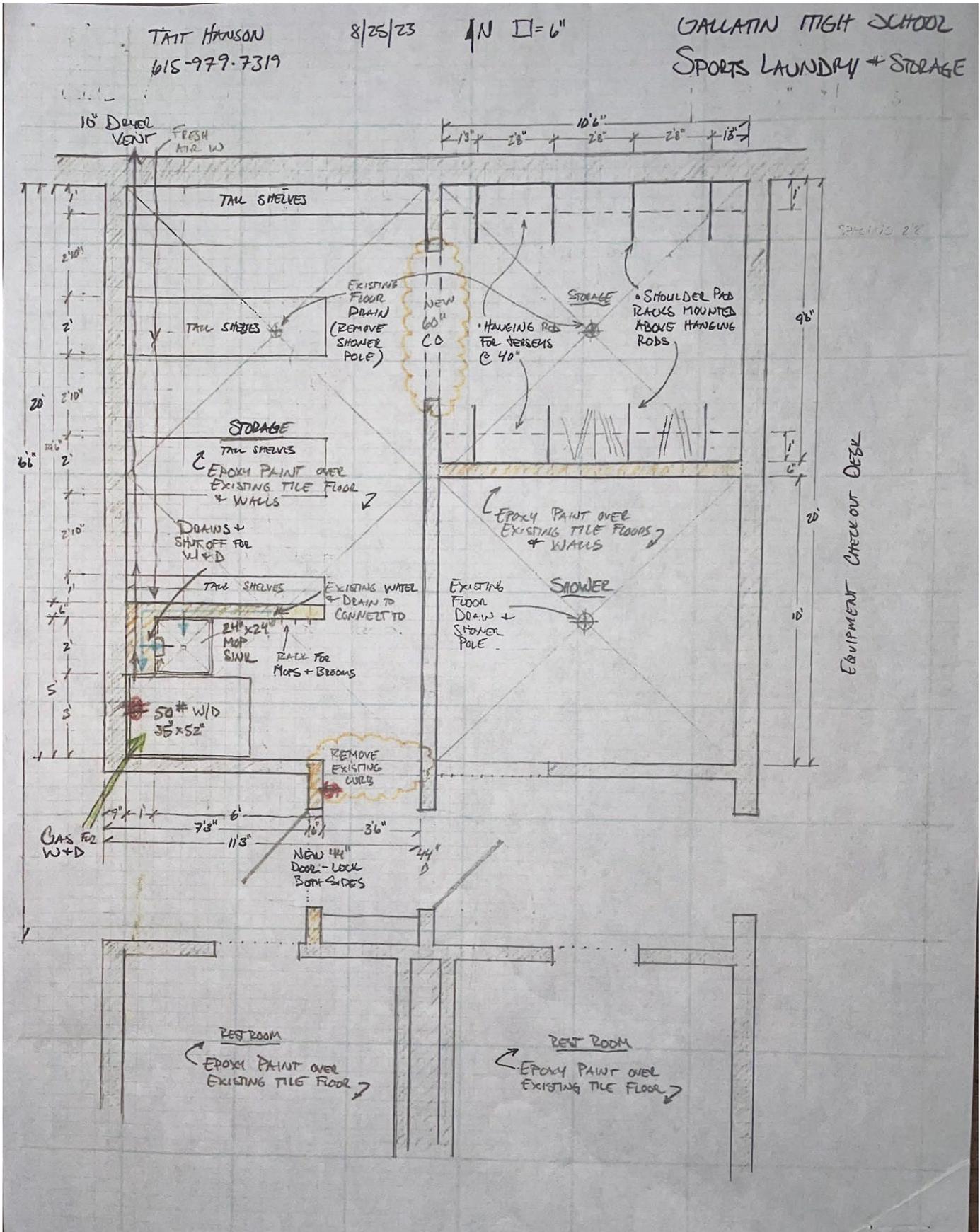
Electrical: Relocate existing light ballasts and install additional lights in each space as needed to create even lighting without casting dark spots. Lights are LED. Football shower room needs to be on a different switch from the storage room behind it. Supply power for 50-pound Speed Queen washer/ dryer stack (spec sheet included in drawings) install 1 outlet in stud wall on the mop sink side.

Gas: Supply gas for 50-pound Speed Queen washer/ dryer stack (spec sheet included in drawings)

HVAC: Supply fresh air intake as well as exhaust vent to outside for 50-pound Speed Queen washer/ dryer stack (spec sheet included in drawings)

Plumbing: Supply water for 50-pound Speed Queen washer/ dryer stack (spec sheet included in drawings) Install shut off valve above mop sink as specified on drawings. Install mop sink. Remove 3 shower towers. Floor drains will be kept in 2 locations, the 3rd will be used for drain plumbing from mop sink and washer.

Room fixtures: remove shelving from existing storage room and install in new storage room. Install new heavy duty hanging rods for jerseys. Remove shoulder pad racks from existing storage and install them above the jersey hanging rods.



Athletic Training Room

All work below done in conjunction with supplied construction drawings.

All products need to be applied per manufacturer instructions including any recommended prep work.

Paint: Sherwin Williams "Teardrop white" oil-based gloss. Applied over a primer coat. (Kilz or equivalent) paint all shelving as well.

Floors: Remove existing VCT tile (one room only) Cover entire floor in epoxy. Prep first by sealing holes and cracks. (see existing epoxy floors in building and match)

Construction: remove door and block up extra door per drawings with 12" CMU. Create a 60" metal frame cased opening in keeping with existing building. Remove dutch door and install new wood 36" door slab with hardware matching existing. Install new 60x42 flush frame fixed window. Patch plumbing holes. Install black base trim where appropriate.

Electrical: install new outlets per drawings, note that some are above countertop height.

Plumbing: route water to other side of existing wall. Plumbing for ice bath, ice machine, and deep sink.

Room fixtures: remove existing shelving and reinstall along south wall. Build face frames for shelving and use ¾" cabinet grade plywood on piano hinges to create full height doors to enclose shelving along south wall. Use supplied cabinetry for 2 drawer stacks, sink base and upper cabinets. Build ice bath surround on 3 sides even with top of ice bath and with 1 step. Ice bath surround top is to be the same as the bathroom stalls and counters. Countertops are to be black laminate.

Sports Facility "Attic" - Locker Room Option

All work below done in conjunction with supplied construction drawings.

All products need to be applied or installed per manufacturer instructions including any recommended prep work.

Framing: 2nd Floor

- Inspect floor joists and bring flooring up to appropriate live load rating. (needs engineers' approval) This will probably involve sistering existing joists or adding joists in between. If work is done from above, new subfloor will need to be laid; if work is done from below, new ceiling tile and grid needs to be installed.
- Frame all new 2nd floor interior walls per drawings. Walls are 2x4 stud 16OC covered with fire rated drywall installation (2 layers of 5/8ths drywall on both sides, seams staggered.)
- Walls facing the open sports facility area need to be fire rated and be able to withstand impacts from sports balls. I am recommending 6" CMU block, but other suitable solutions can be explored.
- Frame 18" tall x 30" bases for lockers in each locker room; these bases will double as mechanical chases for the HVAC ducting and other mechanical needs.
- Plumbing walls are double walled framed with 2x6s with a cavity in between for drainpipes. 2nd floor toilets are WALL MOUNTED and framing needs to be sufficient to support them.
- Restroom walls are to be Covered with mold resistant drywall and then plastic washable waterproof wall panel.

Framing: 1st floor

- Frame in the men's restroom door that opens into the main sports facility area. This wall will be used to run plumbing. Cover with fire rated drywall installation (2 layers of 5/8ths drywall on both sides, seams staggered.)
- Frame in the men's restroom door that opens into the locker room area. Make sure it mirrors the existing wall thickness. Cover with fire rated drywall installation (2 layers of 5/8ths drywall on both sides, seams staggered.)
- Enclose the existing locker room from the front entrance creating a separate hall and locker room.
- Enclose a 2-story stair vestibule off of the 1st floor bathrooms to separate it from the main sports facility area. This wall needs to be fire rated and be able to withstand impacts from sports balls. I am recommending 6" CMU block, but other suitable solutions can be explored.
- Interior Doors: 36"x 88" doors = 15. 72"x88" double doors = 21. Doorknobs and locks are to be Arrow brand, Grade 1, small format interchangeable B123 core.
- Exterior doors: Remove one exterior double door, per drawings, and install one single door 36"x 80". From the 2nd floor there is a double door 72"x88" that accesses an exterior stair over the front entry. Doors should be keyed in keeping with the building but have panic bars.

Stairs:

- Interior and exterior staircases need to be metal and appropriate to meet or exceed fire code and egress requirements.

Electrical:

- Install linkable commercial grade LED strip lights for consistent light coverage across all 2nd floor rooms and hallways as well as in the stair vestibule.
- Install outlets in each of the rooms to code.
- Install 2 counter mounted outlets in the training room.
- Install 220v outlet for stacked W/D in utility room (if storage room behind it. Supply power for 50-pound Speed Queen washer/ dryer stack (spec sheet included in drawings) install 1 outlet in stud wall on the mop sink side.

Gas:

- Move the large heater outside the new vestibule.
- Move existing gas supply to the HVAC units to run tight to the ceiling and against the beams.
- Supply gas for relocated water heater. New water heater location in mechanical room 1.

HVAC:

- Install either an additional HVAC in mechanical room 2 to handle heating and cooling of the 2nd floor or replace the existing HVAC in mechanical room 2 to handle both the 2nd floor as well as its current load.
- Exhaust vent to outside for washer/ dryer stack in utility room.
- Exhaust fan in the wall of the 2nd floor restroom venting to outside. Install new exhaust fans in 1st floor restrooms and vent them to the exterior.

Plumbing:

- Supply water for the washer/ dryer stack and mop sink in the utility room.
- Install new water heater in a new location in mechanical room 1. (probably a gas water heater)
- Install floor drains in the utility room and 2nd floor restroom.
- 2nd floor restroom has 2 sinks and 4 wall mounted toilets.
- Relocate 1st floor men's room sink and drinking fountain.

Insulation:

- Exterior walls need to be insulated to R13 and ceiling needs to be insulated to R38. This includes the wall between the rooms and the main open space of the sports facility.
- Use appropriate vapor barrier and ventilation so as not to cause condensation issues.

Floors:

- Install VCT (Vinyl Composition Tile) floors throughout the 2nd floor. Tile is to match (as closely as possible) to the terrazzo look tile in the halls of the "New Wing" of the main building.
- Flooring options we will consider in the 1st floor men's room and in the new stair vestibule are as follows: The same VCT tile as the 2nd floor, The same epoxy as the 1st floor women's room, or simply polished and sealed concrete.

Paint:

- Paint hall walls in the matching color way to the main building hallway. Sherwin Williams "Teardrop white" "Graystone" "Green Wave Green" and "Green Wave Gold" oil-based gloss. Applied over a primer coat. (Kilz or equivalent)
- Paint locker rooms in Sherwin Williams "Teardrop white" oil-based gloss. Applied over a primer coat. (Kilz or equivalent)

Finishes:

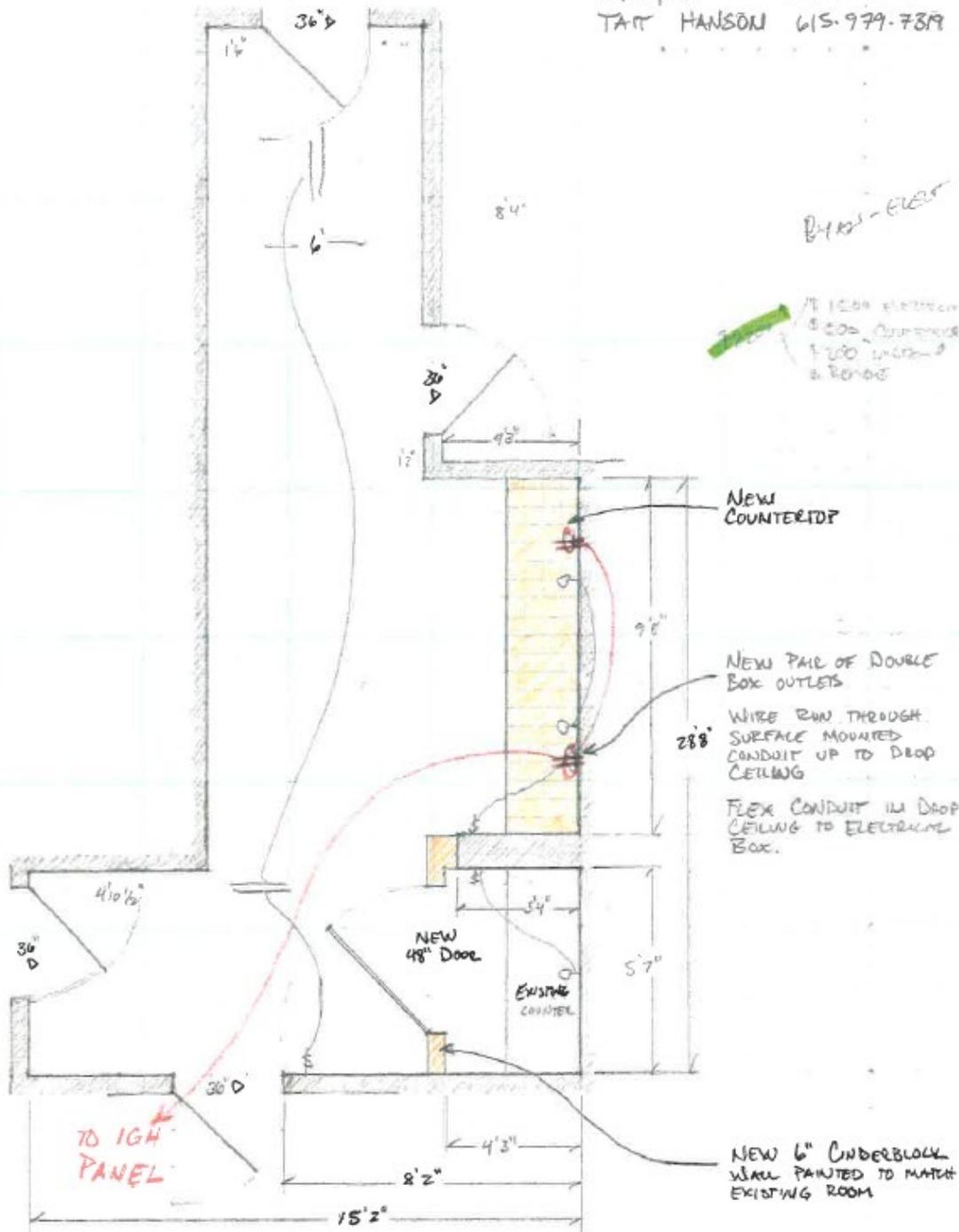
- Cabinetry is to be installed OVER the finished floor.
- Base cabinetry is to be entirely drawers other than the sink base cabinet.
- Countertop is to be black laminate.
- Cabinets in wood grain to coordinate with New Wing cabinetry.
- Submit locker options for our consideration as a part of your bid.
- Locker bases are to be carpeted in low pile commercial grade carpet.
- Ceiling is to be 2x2 drop tile run at the same slope as the roof. Tuck the ceiling up as tight as possible.
- Install black baseboard throughout.
- Partition material for stalls and bathroom countertops is HDPE Black Paisley Sheets, 1" thickness. Supplier is Manning Materials Inc.

Other notes:

- Fix leaks in the roof over the new work area and 10 feet beyond the wall to the sports facility.
- Patch and/or replace exterior metal panels with holes.
- Replace 4 windows in the sports facility building with fixed pane low e windows. Windows must have a mirror film so as not to be able to see in from the outside.
- Any potential issues that may arise based on your experience with certain materials or building methods and your input would be greatly appreciated to address these issues in the most intelligent manner possible.

2.2. Standard Contractor Obligations

- Shall provide and obtain all necessary materials, equipment and labor to perform all items listed in the Scope of Work.
- Shall provide and obtain all necessary permits and schedule all necessary inspections with Local, County, etc. agencies as required by law.
- Shall dispose of all generated waste materials in compliance with all Local, State and Federal guidelines, regulations and requirements.
- Shall have property trained and experienced staff to facilitate the services specified in the Scope of Work. If applicable, the Contractor shall provide documentation that staff has received the manufacturers' certification to complete the services specified in the Statement of Work.

3. Source Selection and Contract Award

- Award(s), if made, will be made to the Responsive and Responsible proposer(s) whose proposal is most advantageous to SCS, taking into consideration price and the other evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP.
 - General Criteria to be determined "Responsive"
 - Does the proposal include all required information, included completed attachment forms and affidavits?
 - Was the proposal delivered on or before the stated deadline? Did it include the required number of copies (hard & electronic)?
 - General Criteria to be determined "Responsible"
 - Does the Proposer demonstrate an understanding of SCSs needs and proposed approach to the project?
 - Does the Proposer possess the ability, capacity, skill and financial resources to provide the service?
 - Can the Proposer take upon itself the responsibilities set forth in the RFP and produce the required outcomes in a timely fashion?
 - Does the Proposer have the character, integrity, reputation, judgement, experience and efficiency required for the project?
- SCS reserves the right to enter into discussions with Proposers which have submitted proposals determined to be reasonably like of being considered for selection to assure a full understanding of and responsiveness to the RFP requirements. Every effort shall be afforded to assure fair and equal treatment with respect to the opportunity for discussion and/or revision of their respective proposals.
- Upon mutual agreement by both parties, SCS shall grant the right to extend the terms, conditions and prices of contract(s) awarded from this RFP to other Institutions (such as State, Local and/or Public Agencies) who express an interest in participating in any contract that results from this RFP. 5. Instructions for Proposal

5.1. Required Forms

- Proposer must complete and submit the Attachments in Section 6. Attachments may be omitted depending on the RFP requirements. Refer to the Table of Contents for omitted Attachments.
- Evidence of a valid State of Tennessee Business License and/or Sumner County Business License.
- For all vendors with annual purchases in excess of \$50,000; a Sumner County Business License must be on file with the SCS Finance Department. Evidence of the license must be provided within ten (10) working days following notification of award; otherwise, SCS may rescind its acceptance of the Proposer’s proposal.
- Copy of State of Tennessee License (if applicable) in respective field.
- If applicable, the Proposer must include a copy of the contract(s) the Proposer will submit to be signed.

5.2. New Vendors

- To comply with Internal Revenue Service requirements, all vendors who perform any type of service are required to have a current IRS Form W-9 on file with the SCS Finance Department. It is a mandatory requirement to complete the IRS Form W-9 (Attachment 6.9) included in this RFP.
- To comply with the **Tennessee Lawful Employment Act (50-1-702 and 50-1-703)**, non-employees (individuals paid directly by the employer in exchange for the individual’s labor or services) must have on file one (1) of the following documents:
 - A valid Tennessee driver’s license or photo identification;
 - A valid driver’s license or photo identification from another state where the license requirements are at least as strict as those in Tennessee;
 - A birth certificate issued by a U.S. state, jurisdiction or territory;
 - A U.S. government issued certified birth certificate;
 - A valid, unexpired U.S. passport;
 - A U.S. certificate of birth abroad (DS-1350 or FS-545)
 - A report of birth abroad of a U.S. citizen (FS-240);

- A certificate of citizenship (N560 or N561);
- A certificate of naturalization (N550, N570 or N578);
- A U.S citizen identification card (I-197 or I-179); or
- Valid alien registration documentation or other proof of current immigration registration recognized by the United States Department of Homeland Security that contains the individual’s complete legal name and current alien admission number or alien file number (or numbers if the individual has more than one number).

5.3. Acknowledgement of Insurance Requirements

By submitting a proposal, Proposer acknowledges that it has read and understands the insurance requirements for the proposal. The Proposer who may have employees, contractors, subcontractors or agents working on SCS properties shall carry current certificates for general and professional liability insurance and for workers’ compensation as indicated below. The owner or Principal of each Proposer must also be insured by workers’ compensation if they perform any of the services on SCS properties. There will be no exceptions to the insurance requirement. Proposer also understands that the evidence of required insurance must be submitted within fifteen (15) working days following notification of its offer being accepted; otherwise, SCS may rescind its acceptance of the Proposers proposal.

5.4. Clarification and Interpretation of RFP

5.7. Evaluation of Proposals

The SCS Purchasing Supervisor will first examine the proposals to reject those that are clearly non-responsive to the stated requirements. Proposers who are determined to be non-responsive and/or non-responsible will be notified of this determination.

The evaluation process will include the following factors:

- Company Experience and Qualifications
 - The nature and scope of the Proposers business.
 - The number of years the Proposer has been licensed to do business.
 - The number of years the Proposer has been providing the requested services.
 - How many similarly sized or larger K-12 clients have you contract with?
- Compensation/Price Data
 - Address all costs associated with performance of the contracted services.
- Past Performance and References
 - Provided a minimum of three (3) client references for similar projects in size and scope successfully completed by Proposer within the last three (3) years. Attachment 6.3.
 - SCS may also consider other sources of pertinent past performance information, including the districts own experience with the Proposer.

5.8. Request for Clarification of Proposals

Requests for clarification of proposals shall be distributed by the Purchasing Supervisor in writing (or email). Any questions concerning the bid documents must be received by the Purchasing Supervisor no less than ninety-six (96) hours before the bid opening date. **T.C.A. § 12-4-113 (b)**

No addenda will be issued within less than forty-eight (48) hours of the bid opening date, excluding weekends and legal holidays, unless the bid deadline is extended for a reasonable period as determined by the Purchasing Supervisor, which shall not be less than forty-eight (48) hours, excluding weekends and legal holidays, to all for any necessary changes to the bid documents and to allow proposers to resubmit their bids accordingly. **T.C.A. § 12-4-113 (a)**

5.9. Protests

In the event that any interested party finds any part of the listed specifications, terms or conditions to be discrepant, incomplete or otherwise questionable in any respect; it shall be the responsibility of the concerned party to notify the SCS Purchasing Office of such matters immediately upon receipt of the RFP. All notifications must be sent to the Purchasing Supervisor via email at purchasing@sumnerschools.org.

Any actual or prospective Proposer who is aggrieved in connection with the RFP or award of a contract may protest to the Purchasing Supervisor and/or the Sumner County Board of Education at its regularly scheduled meeting.

SUMNER COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION (SCS)**

1. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BID.

- a. Failure to examine any drawings, specifications, or instructions will be at the proposer's risk. Any deviation from the stated terms, conditions and specifications must be coordinated with and approved in writing by the SCS Purchasing Supervisor.
- b. RFP/ITB SUBMITTAL / SIGNATURE: Proposal shall give the full name and business address of the bidder. If the proposer is a corporation, the name shall be stated as it is in the corporate charter. Proposals must be signed in ink by the proposer's authorized agent. Unsigned proposals will be rejected. Proposals are to be sealed and the outside of the envelope is to reference the RFP/ITB number. The person signing the proposal must show their title, and if requested by the institution, must furnish satisfactory proof of his or her authority to bind his or her company in contract. Proposer understands that by submitting a proposal with an authorized signature, it shall constitute an offer to SCS. Proposals must be typewritten or in ink; otherwise they may not be considered. Purchase orders will be issued to the firm name appearing on the W9. Electronic submissions via email, fax, etc. shall not be accepted.
- c. SCS is not responsible for any costs incurred by any vendor pursuant to the RFP/ITB. The vendor shall be responsible for all costs incurred in connection with the preparation and submission of its proposal.
- d. All proposers must be in compliance with **T.C.A. § 62-6-119** at the time of proposal submission and provide evidence of compliance with the applicable provisions of the chapter before such proposal may be considered.
- e. Proposals are to be received in the location designated in the RFP/ITB no later than the specified date and time. Late submissions will NOT be opened or considered.
- f. No erasures permitted. Errors may be crossed out and corrections printed in ink or typewritten adjacent to error and must be initialed in ink by person signing the proposal.
- g. Specifications: Reference to available specifications shall be sufficient to make the terms of the specifications binding on the proposer. The use of the name of a manufacturer, or any special brand or make in describing an item does not restrict the proposer to that manufacturer or specific article, unless specifically stated. Comparable products of other manufacturers will be considered if proof of compatibility is contained in the proposal. Proposers are required to notify SCSs Purchasing Supervisor whenever specifications/procedures are not perceived to be fair and open. The articles on which the proposal is submitted must be equal or superior to that specified. Informative and Descriptive Literature: The proposer must show brand or trade names of the articles proposed, when applicable. It shall be the responsibility of the proposer, including proposer's whose product is referenced, to furnish with the proposer such specifications, catalog pages, brochures or other data as will provide an adequate basis for determining the quality and functional capabilities of the product offered. Failure to provide this data may be considered valid justification for rejection of proposer.
- h. Samples: Samples of items when called for, must be furnished free of expense, and if not destroyed will, upon proposer's request within ten (10) days of RFP/ITB opening, be returned at the proposer's expense. Each sample must be labeled with the proposer's name, manufacturer's brand name and number, RFP/ITB number and item reference.
- i. Time of Performance: The number of calendar days in which delivery is to be made after receipt of order shall be stated in the RFP/ITB and may be a factor in making an award, price notwithstanding. If no delivery time is stated in the bid, bidder agrees that delivery is to be made within two weeks (10 business days) of order.
- j. Transportation and delivery charges should be included in the price and be fully prepaid by the vendor to the destination specified in the RFP/ITB. Proposal prices shall include delivery of all items F.O.B. destination.
- k. New materials and supplies must be delivered unless otherwise specifically stated in the RFP/ITB.
- l. Alternate/multiple bids will not be considered unless specifically called for in the RFP/ITB.
- m. Only proposals submitted on RFP/ITB forms furnished by SCS will be considered.
- n. By signing this RFP/ITB where indicated, the proposer agrees to strictly abide by all applicable local, state and federal statutes and regulations. The proposer further certifies that this proposal is made without collusion or fraud.
- o. Error in Proposal. In case of error in the extension of prices in the proposal, the unit price will govern. Late submissions will NOT be opened or considered. Proposers are cautioned to verify their proposals before submission, as amendments received after the RFP/ITB deadline will not be considered. No proposals shall be altered, amended or withdrawn after opening. After proposal opening, a proposer may withdraw a proposal only when there is obvious clerical error such as a misplaced decimal point, or when enforcement of the proposal would impose unconscionable hardship due to an error in the proposal resulting in a quotation substantially below the other proposals received. Proposal withdrawals will be considered only upon written request of the proposer.

2. **OPEN RECORDS.** In order to comply with the provisions of the **Tennessee Open Records Act**, all proposals will be publicly opened and are subject to public inspection after the award upon written request. Proposers may be present at RFP/ITB opening. Summary information will be posted the SCS website, www.sumnerschools.org under the Invitation to Bid link.

- 3. ACCEPTANCE AND AWARD.** SCS reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and to waive any informality in proposals and, unless otherwise specified by the proposer to accept any item in the proposal. Action to reject all proposals shall be taken for unreasonably high prices, errors in the proposal documents, cessation of need, unavailability of funds, or any other reason approved by SCS.
- a. Contracts and purchases will be made with the lowest, responsive, responsible, qualified proposer. The quality of the articles to be supplied, their conformity with the specifications, their suitability to the requirements of the Institution, cash discount offered, and the delivery terms will be taken into consideration.
 - b. Any deviation from these stated terms, specifications and conditions must be coordinated with and approved in writing by the Purchasing Supervisor.
 - c. Prices quoted on the response (if any) are to be considered firm and binding until the said equipment, supplies or services are in the possession of SCS.
 - d. If, during the performance of this contract, the cost of materials increases, through no fault of the contractor, the price of materials shall be equitably adjusted by an amount reasonably necessary to cover any such increase in the cost of materials. The contractor shall provide evidence of the cost increase prior to its' implementation. Annual or Multi-Year Contracts ONLY. Any increase in cost must be approved by SCS.
 - e. SCS reserves the right to order more or less than the quantity listed in the proposal.
 - f. If a proposer fails to state a time within which a proposal must be accepted, it is understood and agreed that SCS shall have ninety (90) days to accept.
 - g. No purchase or contract is authorized or valid until the issuance of a SCS purchase order in accordance with SCS policy. No SCS employee is authorized to purchase equipment, supplies or services prior to the issuance of such a purchase order.
 - h. The contract may not be assigned without written SCS consent.
 - i. If the appropriate space is marked on the RFP/ITB, other Institutions (such as State, Local and/or Public Agencies) may purchase off the contract during the same period as SCS.
 - j. The awarded proposer will be required to post a performance and payment bond in the amount of 25% of the contract price if it exceeds \$100,000 as stated by **T.C.A. §12-4-201**.
 - k. If the project cost is in excess of \$25,000 a performance bond must be secured by the requesting part in an amount equal to the market improvement value.
 - l. By submission of this bid and signature thereof, the Bidder acknowledges compliance with the provisions of **Public Chapter No. 587 / Senate Bill No. 2048** (Employee Background Check). The Bidder further agrees to submit a formal certification thereof prior to commencing work.
- 4. PAYMENT.** Payment terms must be specified in the proposal, including any discounts for early payment. Partial payments will not be approved unless justification for such payment can be shown. Terms will be NET 30 days. Payment will not be made until the conditions and specifications of the RFP/ITB are inspected and approved as conforming by persons appointed by SCS.
- 5. DEFAULT OF SELECTED VENDOR.** In case of vendor default, SCS may procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the defaulting vendor responsible for any resulting cost. If the awarded vendor violates any terms of their response, the contract, SCS policy or any law, they may be disqualified from proposing for a period of two years for minor violations or longer for major violations. Proposals from disqualified proposers will not be accepted during the period of disqualification.
- 6. INSPECTION OF PURCHASES.** Articles received which are not equivalent will not be accepted and will be picked up by the vendor or returned to vendor, shipping charges collect. SCS shall have a reasonable period in which to inspect and accept or reject materials without liability. If necessity requires SCS to use nonconforming materials, an appropriate reduction in payment may be made.
- 7. TAXES.** SCS is tax exempt; do not include taxes in quotation. Vendors making improvements or additions to or performing repair work on real property for SCS are liable for any applicable sales or use tax on tangible personal property used in connection with the contract or furnished to vendors by the state for use under the contract.
- 8. NONDISCRIMINATION.** SCS is an equal opportunity employer. SCS reserves the right to render the proposal unresponsive and subject the proposal to rejection if successful terms cannot be negotiated.

- 10. Any action arising from any contract made from this RFP/ITB shall be brought in the state courts in Sumner County, TN or in the United States Federal District Court for the Middle District of Tennessee.
- Additionally, it is a violation of state statutes to purchase materials, supplies, services or any other item from a vendor that is a commissioner, official, employee or board member that has any financial or beneficial interest in such transaction, T.C.A. §12-4-101.
- 15. FUNDS.** The Proposer understands and accepts the non-appropriation of funds provision of SCS.
- 16. DATA PRIVACY AND SECURITY.** Personal Information (PI) includes but is not limited to that information protected by HIPAA, the HITECH Act, FERPA, or Gramm-Leach-Bliley) or such information which would allow a third party to gain access to the personal, medical or financial records of any of any party. Vendor represents and warrants that its collection, access, use, storage, disposal and disclosure of PI complies with all applicable federal and state privacy and data protection laws. Vendor represents and warrants that Vendor will maintain compliance with the SSAE 16 standard, and shall undertake any audits and risk assessments Vendor deems necessary to maintain compliance with SSAE16. If PI provided by SCS to Vendor is subject to FERPA. Vendor agrees that in its handling of FERPA data it will perform as a school official as that term is defined by FERPA regulations. Vendor acknowledges that its improper disclosure or re-disclosure of PI covered by FERPA may, under certain circumstances, result in Vendor's exclusion from eligibility to contract with SCS for at least five (5) years. Vendor shall provide SCS with the name and contact information for an employee of Vendor who shall serve as SCS's primary security contact and shall be available to assist Customer twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week as a contact in resolving obligations associated with any security incident in which it is reasonably suspected that there has been a breach of information security. Vendor shall immediately mitigate or resolve any Security Incident, at Vendor's expense and in accordance with applicable privacy rights, laws, regulations and standards. Vendor shall reimburse SCS for actual costs incurred by SCS in responding to, and mitigating damages caused by, any Security Incident, including all costs of notice and/or remediation incurred under applicable law as a result of the Security Incident.
- 17. IRAN DIVESTMENT ACT.** By submission of this proposal, each proposer and each person signing on behalf of any proposer certified, and in the case of a joint proposal, each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of its knowledge and belief that each proposer is not on the list created pursuant to T.C.A. §12-12-106.
- 18. NON-BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL.** The Contractor certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not for the duration of the contract engage in, a boycott of Israel as defined by T.C.A. § 12-4-119.
- 19. COMPLIANCE WITH CONDUCT STANDARDS.** Contractors shall be fully responsible for the conduct of its employees, subcontractors, representatives and agents. Loud or offensive music, language or behavior is unacceptable. Tobacco use of any type and vaping is prohibited on SCS property. Contact or interaction with staff or students is not allowed excepted between designated representatives of SCS and Contractor.
